## Shakespeare at the Huntington:

Is a unique, two-week institute for English and Drama teachers, presented by The Huntington Library, Art Collections and Botanical Gardens. The Institute focuses on teaching Shakespeare through performance.

## The Course Features:

An international faculty of scholars, educators and theatre professionals; and takes advantage of one of the world's great libraries and research centers, its extraordinary gardens, and its proximity to the entertainment capital of the world. The course is presented with the support of the English Speaking Union-L.A.

## Topics Covered Include:

Scene study, verse and text work, voice, movement, classroom pedagogy, theatre history and criticism. Attendance at selected plays and museums is required during the two week course. Outside reading and a final evaluation are also required.
